

Tompkins is currently taking a break from live performance, a biographical note that informs her presentation here at playbill. With her text works acting as scores—often literally being organised in clumps of speech for her live performances—a series of audio works will stand in for her embodied voice, ambushing the audience at unexpected moments. In this way, ACT XII plays with the suspension of the performer, the one acting from the sidelines, deliberately refraining from taking the stage.
